Warren County, through the "First Wilderness Heritage Corridor Plan", undertook a planning process different from past traditional efforts in order to strengthen the Hudson River communities and their economies. Town officials and concerned residents from Johnsbury, Chester, Warrensburg, Thurman, Stony Creek and Lake Luzerne recognized that they experienced similar problems and issues that crossed politically defined boundaries and were bound by geography and the existing "built" environment. It was their intent to approach the planning process through a collaborative effort and proceed to examine those critical elements that they shared in common. This recognition provided the basis for developing a plan that acknowledged the history and significance of the Hudson River and the redevelopment of the rail lines of Adirondack Branch of the Delaware and Hudson Railroad within each community. The river and the rail line became the "thread" that bound these communities together as they proceeded with formulating the Plan. Discussions on local needs, public commitments to sustaining rural character and protecting natural resources elevated to new levels as these Adirondack communities readily adopted identity with the.... First Wilderness Heritage Corridor.

The Plan and its course for action fit well with Warren County's planned investment to reestablish the rail line for either freight or tourism activity. A combination of local and federal funding was secured to improve the rail line, establish station stops and to connect by rail - the Hamlet of North Creek in the Town of Johnsbury to Saratoga Springs and beyond. Authenticity of experience for the traveler, preservation of natural resources, rural character and the essence of "place" as well as the creation of new jobs became the unifying goals for the ty that comprise this 60-mile corridor.

This planning project was initiated in 1999 by the Warren County Planning Department and financially supported by the County of Warren, NYS Department of State - Local Waterfront Revitalization Program, NYS Quality Communities Program and Saratoga County. The Plan has received an Outstanding Planning Award for 2003 by the Upstate New York Chapter of the American Planning Association.
